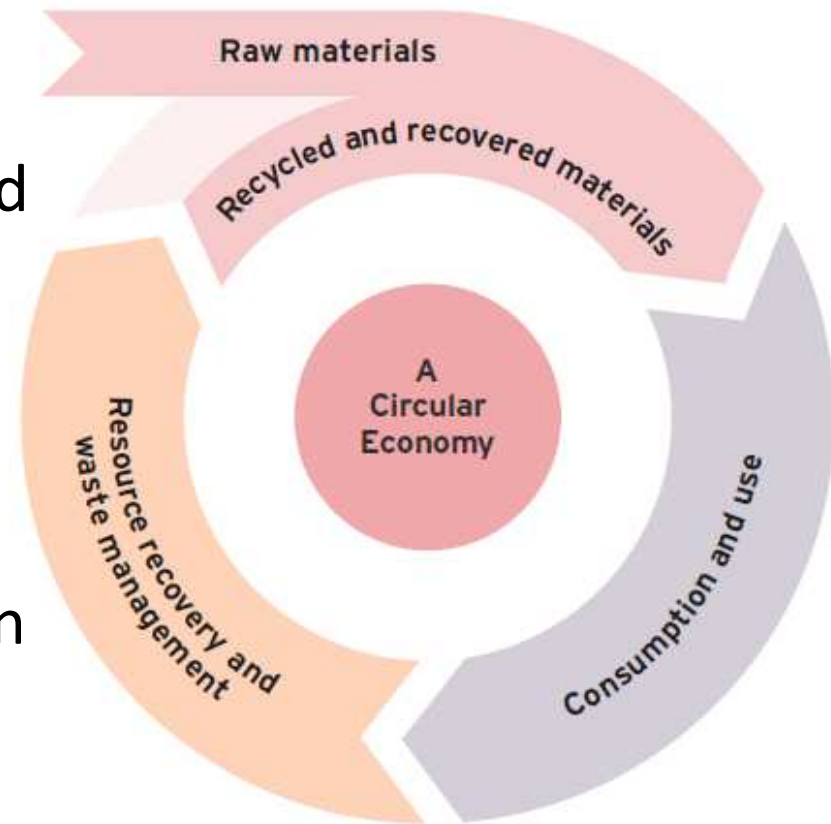

National Resources & Waste Strategy

- New document issued by central government
- Details are yet to be established through consultation
- Indicates a bigger step change for local authorities across the country, moving more in line with policies already adopted in Scotland and Wales

New National Strategy: Current Indications

Collection Consistency Framework

Multi-stream with separate food

 Residual waste (up to a maximum equivalent of 120 litres weekly)

Minimum of 120 litres collected weekly

 Plastics, metals and cartons

 Glass and card*

 Paper

 Food

Two-stream (fibres separate) with separate food

 Residual waste (up to a maximum equivalent of 120 litres weekly)

Co-mingled with separate food

New National Strategy: Current Indications

Extended Producer Responsibility

- Potential funding source for local authorities from plastic producers creating 'on-the-go' waste
- Highly likely that 'consistency' will feature as a requirement to qualify for this funding.



New National Strategy: Current Indications

- Deposit return scheme
- Food waste mandatory from 2023
 - Subject to consultation 2019
- Review of regulations
 - Waste Carriers Licence
 - Duty of Care
 - Controlled Waste Regulations
- Review of how recycling is calculated
 - Separate dry recycling and garden waste



New National Strategy: Current Indications

- Garden waste collection service
 - To be clarified in consultation
- Incineration tax
 - Subject to consultation
- Green Brexit
 - yet to be defined
- Review performance indicators
- Re-issue of national strategy in 2023

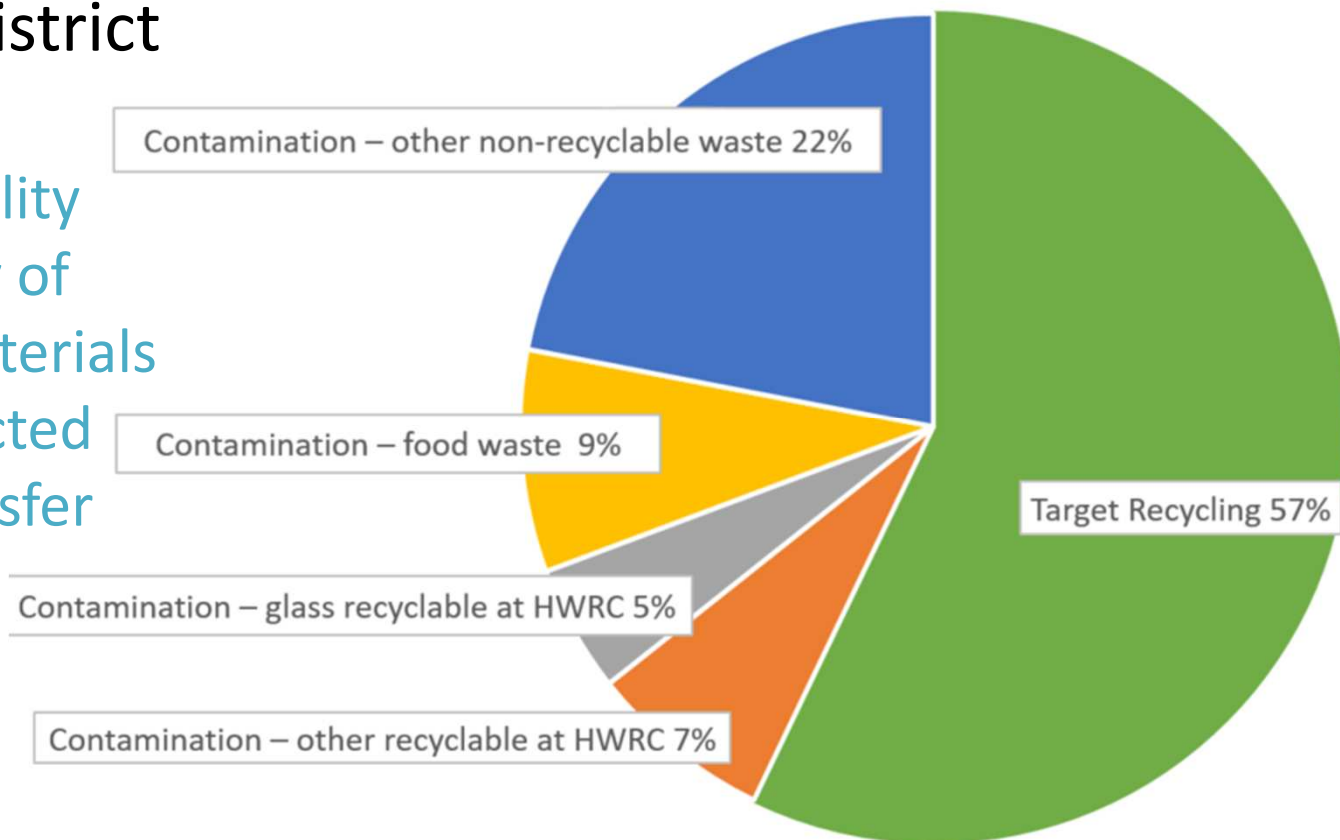

Short Term Options Pending Service Review

Green bin monitoring and focused recycling education across the district

- Improve quality and quantity of recycling materials
- Reduce rejected loads at transfer station



Short Term Options Pending Service Review

- Chargeable garden waste collection service
 - Increase range of recycling services available to residents
 - Potential recycling rate boost by 4%
- District wide 'Save Food Save Money' workshops and events
 - Expand successful trial project in Ravensthorpe
 - Community classes to encourage:
 - saving money on the weekly shop; healthy eating; active lifestyles (ie. gardening) and reducing waste.
