## 1. Purpose of report

To consider allocation of places/ratios, as appropriate, to various Outside Bodies.

## 2. Key points

The Council's representation on the various Outside Bodies/other Committees is split into a three part schedule Copies of Schedules 1 and 2 are attached. Schedule 1 is primarily concerned with representation on joint authorities and major bodies. Schedule 2 is concerned with other bodies, and Schedule 3 is primarily concerned with representation on charities which are referred to Town and Valley Committees to put forward nominations.

The Council is responsible for overall allocations/ratios, as appropriate for those bodies within its remit, and Cabinet is responsible for nominations to bodies concerned with executive functions. The Assistant Director, Legal, Governance and Monitoring, has delegated authority, in consultation with Group Business Managers, to receive and process nominations.

The schedules provided with this report have been adjusted only insofar as to delete any representatives who retired/lost their seat this time, unless under the particular organisation's constitution they need not be an elected Member, so could continue in office.

In relation to the Yorkshire Purchasing Organisation Joint Committee a request has been received that each of the constituent Authorities should pass a resolution, waiving political balance rules which are applicable to the Yorkshire Purchasing Organisation Joint Committee, and also determine which of the Council's two nominees will have the one vote on behalf of the Authority.

The Council's interests will be represented by the appointed representatives.

Following approval, the various Outside Bodies will be notified of the nominations.

#### 6. Officer recommendations and reasons

That, in order to fill places on the various Outside Bodies:

- (1) That Council confirms the allocation of places/ratios, as appropriate in Schedules 1 and 2 and notes that Group Business Managers will put forward nominations to the Acting Assistant Director, Legal, Governance and Monitoring, to fill any vacancies or make any adjustments to nominees previously put forward as appropriate.
- (2) That those bodies with executive functions be referred to Cabinet to put forward nominations.
- (3) That, in relation to the Yorkshire Purchasing Organisation Joint Committee, the Council agrees to waive political balance rules which apply in accordance with Section 17 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 (this requires approval with no Member voting

against); and that Cabinet, in determining the nominees, resolves which Member will have the one vote on behalf of the Council.
