## **AGREEMENT**

### **Between the leaders of the twin towns of Kostanai (the Republic of Kazakhstan) and Kirklees (the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) for 2002 - 2003.**

The leaders of Kostanai and Kirklees have agreed on the following:

#### **ARTICLE 1**

1.1 The visits and exchanges provided in the present agreement are to take place in conformity with laws and rules having force in the Republic of Kazakhstan and in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland correspondingly. The sides are to do everything depending on them for ensuring favourable conditions to make sure visits and exchanges are possible.

1.2 The visits and exchanges provided by the present agreement do not exclude other visits and exchanges that can be organised by the sides, enterprises or organisations.

1.3 Each side has the right to include in its delegations, interpreters or representatives of the city leadership in its composition within the limits of the delegation members. This number must be agreed upon both sides previously.

1.4 In accordance with the present agreement, the delegations are to pay their expenses for travelling between the Republic of Kazakhstan and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland as well as those expenses within their own country. Travelling in the visited country as well as all the expenses of the stay are paid by the accepting side, within the budgetary constraints of the accepting side.

#### **ARTICLE 2**

The sides will contribute to the development of exchanges in the field of education.

2.1 During the time the agreement is in effect annual 11 month long exchanges of up to two 17-18 year olds secondary school students from each side will take place.

2.2 Kostanai Town Education Department will select the students from Kostanai. They will study at Greenhead College, Huddersfield. Kirklees Council Corporate Development Unit will select the students from Kirklees. They will assist with English teaching in schools and colleges in Kostanai and study Russian at Kostanai Gymnasium School.

Kirklees Council will meet the costs of accommodation, travel and medical and incidental expenses for the students from Kostanai whilst they are in the United Kingdom. Greenhead Sixth Form College will meet the costs of their tuition and books.

Kostanai Town Administration will meet the cost of accommodation, travel, medical and incidental expenses of the students from Kirklees whilst they are in Kazakhstan.

The accepting side will provide the school students with pocket money of £25 per week in Great Britain and the equivalent sum in Tenge in the Kazakh Republic based on local costs. (The weekly rate to be calculated as 7% of the average weekly salary for teachers in Kostanai).

2.3 If both sides agree and resources are available, short exchanges of school students, teachers or other representatives of education will be arranged.

2.4. The Kirklees side will pass on information to Kostanai about private summer schools/courses in English as a Foreign Language in the Kirklees area for adults and school children.

### **ARTICLE 3**

In summer 2002 the official visit from Kostanai to Kirklees will take place.

### **ARTICLE 4**

The contracting parties take the following pledges:

4.1 In case of illness or accident of a member of the delegation the accepting side ensures the necessary free aid. In addition the sides undertake to take out any necessary insurance and arrange repatriation if necessary.

4.2 Each side agrees to take part, and assist in, arranging visas for official visits on which the sides agree, and for private visits between citizens of Kirklees and Kostanai.

4.3 Each side agrees to organise exchanges of visits of official representatives of the twin towns every two years.

### **ARTICLE 5**

Private Exchanges:

5.1 The sides consider personal contacts to be important for the cause of peace and friendship between peoples and will facilitate private trips agreed upon between the citizens of Kirklees and Kostanai.

**5.2** The sides will promote co-operation between organisations and individuals in Kostanai and Kirklees by responding to requests for information about organisations in the other twin town including how people can contact their counterparts in the other twin town.

**ARTICLE 6**

The present Agreement comes into effect from January 2002 and is to be in force till December 31<sup>st</sup> 2003.

Agreed in Kostanai in two copies, each in Russian and English, both texts are of equal force.
