1. Purpose of report

1.1 To provide members of the Calderdale and Kirklees Joint Health Scrutiny Committee with an update on the work that is being undertaken to support the transformational changes that are being developed to Health and Social Care Services in Calderdale and Greater Huddersfield.

2. Key Points

2.1 At the meeting of the Joint Committee that was held on 22 September 2014 members were presented with an overview of the proposals to change the way that health and social care is delivered in Calderdale and Greater Huddersfield; the engagement activity that had taken

place; plans for further engagement; and the work that had been undertaken to look at hospital services.

- 2.2 Since the September meeting Calderdale CCG and Greater Huddersfield CCG have continued to shape proposals that will provide models of care that will support care either at or closer to home.
- 2.3 Both CCG's have publicly outlined the phases that will be followed to strengthen and enhance community services in line with the new model of care and are working towards developing proposals for changes to hospital services that will result from improved community provision.
- 2.4 Senior representatives from Calderdale CCG and Greater Huddersfield CCG will be in attendance to update the committee on the progress of the work that has taken place in their respective Care Closer to Home programmes and an explanation on how these will be used to support changes to hospital services.
- 2.5 In addition the committee will be provided with:
 - The context to the indicative timetable for change.
 - The work that has been undertaken by the Hospital Service Programme Board and Quality and Safety Assurance Group.
 - An overview of the governance arrangements supporting the change programme.
 - A response to the providers Outline Business Case.
- 2.6 Attached are reports from Calderdale CCG and Greater Huddersfield CCG to help inform the discussions.
