## SCHOOL FUNDING REFORMS - NEXT STEPS FOR FINANCIAL YEAR 2014-15 Initial submission to EFA October 2103

## 1) CHANGES TO THE SCHOOLS BLOCK FUNDING FORMULA

**LOW PRIOR ATTAINMENT** – extension of the Secondary measure to pick up students falling behind in English **OR** Maths (rather than in both subjects).

**PUPIL MOBILITY** – introduction of a 10% threshold from 14-15. Funding can only be allocated beyond this 10% mark.

**SPARSITY FACTOR** – help for isolated rural schools. Criteria: - Small schools only [Primary fewer than 150 pupils, Secondary fewer than 600] and where the average distance to pupils' second nearest schools is more than two miles or three miles respectively.

**DIFFERENTIAL SECTORAL LUMP SUMS** – Lump sum ceiling value lowered from £200k to £175k from 2014-15. Primary lump sum value and Secondary lump sum value can be different from 2014-15.

## 2) OTHER CHANGES TO BE CONSIDERED

**DE-DELEGATION DECISIONS FOR 2014-15** – decisions taken last year covered 13-14 only. Schools need to decide again the de-delegation pattern for 2014-15.

**ESTABLISHMENT OF A FALLING ROLLS FUND** – Local authorities can top-slice funding to create a small fund to support good or outstanding schools (with short-term falling rolls) where local planning data show that their surplus places will be needed in the near future.

**FORMULA-BASED SUPPORT FOR DISPROPORTIONATE SEN NUMBERS** – local authorities can use their High Needs block funding to make additional allocations to schools that have a disproportionate population of pupils with high needs. We are asked to construct a formula basis to underpin any such allocations.
