1. Purpose of report

To inform Members of the current position in relation to proposed actions.

2. Key points

Currently, Private Hire Operators are required to adhere to the conditions a copy of which is attached.

In some circumstances dependent on the premises and location of an Operator base, the conditions may be amended by adding extra conditions pertinent to the individual application.

It has become clear that over time a number of Operators breach the conditions of their licence and in some cases do not appear to be aware of them at all.

Examples of breaches are a failure to keep records of drivers and vehicles licences and continuing to despatch these drivers/vehicles on jobs where they are not fully compliant with their licence or the licence has expired. This has a

potential to nullify insurance as most insurance companies make it a condition of the motor insurance that the vehicle and driver most be fully compliant with the licensing regime for the district in which the vehicle and driver is based.

Officers have on occasion difficulty accessing booking records when it is a legal requirement to disclose that information when requested to do so by an authorised officer of the Council or a police officer.

Many Operators do not appear to be aware the legal responsibilities they have when licensed as a Private Hire Operator.

To address this concern, officers propose to design and implement a Private Hire Training Course which would be a compulsory requirement before being granted an Operator Licence in Kirklees. The course could also be used with existing Operators where they are found to be breach of their Operator Licence. An outline of the course modules is attached.
