1. Purpose of report

Street Trading Policy

2. Key Points

Street Trading comes under Section 3 Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, all streets within the Kirklees area are designated as consent streets for the purposes of Street Trading, having effect from 1st May 1993. This was decided at the Policy and Resources (General Purposes) Sub-Committee dated 21st October 1992 and 17th February 1993.

Kirklees Council currently only has a process for issuing Street Trading Permits to traders who wish to trade from one pitch and they must obtain a licence for each pitch they wish to trade from. Therefore traders such as ice cream vendors do not have any permit from the Council and as such the Council have no way of regulating them. This policy includes ice cream vans and other mobile vendors such as fruit and veg sellers. The policy also covers temporary street traders who

wish to trade from events held within Kirklees and there is a clear process for both the applicant and Licensing department to follow.
