1 Minutes of Previous Meeting

6 Application For Review Hearing Under S51 Licensing Act 2003 - Le Choix, 400 Bradford Road, Batley, WF17 5LZ

The Panel considered an application made by West Yorkshire Police to review a premises licence, in respect of Le Choix under Section 51(1) of the Licensing Act 2003. The Licensing Officer outlined the details of the application advising the Panel that West Yorkshire Police asked for a review as it believed that the licensing objectives in respect of the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety were not being achieved.

Licensing Panel - 6 March 2017

Temporary Police Sergeant Stansfield advised the Panel that over the past few months Le Choix had demonstrated that both the current and previous management, owner and DPS were not fit for purpose, having continually breached the requirements of the premises licensing operating times and conditions. On at least four occasions between 17 December and 24 December 2016, Le Choix had opened over one hour outside its licensed opening hours to trade; and two hours after the licence restricts the sale of alcohol.

The Licensing Officer made representations in support of the review on behalf of Licensing as a Responsible Authority and explained that it has been the experience of all concerned that the management of this premises has been questionable, demonstrated by a continued failure to operate within the requirements of the Licensing Act and to ensure that the Licensing Objectives are met.

The premises licence holder and the DPS addressed the Panel advocating that measures had been put in place to ensure public safety, including employing experienced door staff and a bar supervisor who has been in the trade for 40 years. Refurbishments costing approximately £150k had been undertaken and the venue was now in good order and of benefit to the local community. Since January 2017, there had not been one occasion where the bar had not closed on time. After considering all the representations made both verbally and in writing the Panel determined that:

RESOLVED - the licence in respect of Le Choix Bar should be revoked. In arriving at its decision the Panel also took into account the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Licensing Act 2003, Regulations made there under guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182 of the Act and the Licensing Objective themselves.

The Panel recognised that whilst it had a range of options was sufficiently persuaded that revocation of the license was a necessary and proportionate step. The Panel was not confident that the Premises Licence Holder would ensure compliance with the conditions of the license and ensure that the objectives were met.

2. Information required to take a decision

The premises currently benefit from a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 – PR(A)0892 which can be seen at appendix B. The premises have been running ever since the licensing Act came in into force in 2005 and applied for a conversion/variation on 27/07/2005. The premises licence holder is Leslie Country Inns and has held the licence since July 2012.

3. Implications for the Council

- The adequacy and impact of car parking on local residents or businesses;
- The scope for mitigating any impact;
- How often the activity occurs.

and, in considering any application for a variation the Licensing Authority may also take into account

- historical evidence, whether favourable or adverse, relating to activities carried out at the premises, especially on local residents or businesses;

- and where adverse impact has been caused, appropriate measures have been agreed and put into effect by the applicant to mitigate that adverse impact.

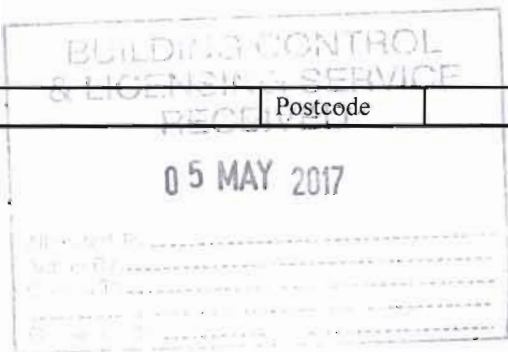

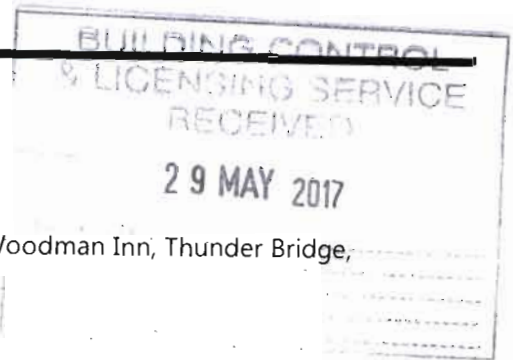

Dear Sir/Madam,

We have been made aware of Licensing Application number 138128 made by the Woodman Inn, Thunderbridge. As residents of Thunderbridge in close proximity to these premises we wish to make an objection to this application on the following grounds:

1) NOISE - Thunderbridge is a small rural residential hamlet with one public house (The Woodman). Traditionally the pub has operated as a country pub style eatery / restaurant, and therefore when functions such as weddings have been held then any noise created has been largely contained within the main structure of the original pub itself. This has proved acceptable to the residents of Thunderbridge by and large.

The new application requests that the premises be open from 0800 to 0030 Sunday to Thursday and 0800 to 0130 Friday and Saturday. It also requests this to be extended to the new orangery and outside garden area. This would presumably involve an even larger number of people milling around the hamlet, and would bring with it significant noise disruption from the inevitable chatter, shouting and ambient noise created by any large social gathering. Any such noise would be heard by all residents of the village. This would only be exacerbated by the application request of alcohol sale for consumption on and off premises from 1000 to 0000 Sunday to Thursday and 1000 to 0100 Friday and Saturday.

The new application specifically requests a licence for playing live music, recorded music, and any entertainment inside AND OUTSIDE from 1000 to 2300 on Sunday to Thursday and 1000 to 0000 Friday and Saturday. Clearly, the noise levels created would be over and above that created by a crowd of people alone. It would be heard by all residents, almost certainly even if we are within our dwellings with windows closed. This is frankly unacceptable, antisocial, and shows a complete lack of consideration for all residents within the hamlet.

In short, we have grave concerns for the granting of any sort of licence which would permit significant noise pollution to adversely affect the quality of life of residents. We would be deeply unimpressed if prevented from sleeping and having our working lives affected because of a live band still playing music at the stroke of midnight. In particular one of us is a shift worker who frequently has to be awake for 0500hrs.

2- PARKING - Thunderbridge is a small hamlet with one through road. The pub has a small carpark opposite the pub and a larger one adjacent to it. Nevertheless, even at present, there is insufficient parking provision for the pub's customers. Throughout the week but especially at the weekend the roadside is an unbroken line of parked vehicles belonging to pub customers, obviously forced to park there because both pub carparks are full.

This not only precludes residents from parking on the road, but also causes access restrictions for those residents fortunate enough to have a driveway. In addition, there are safety implications both in terms of people crossing the road to the orangery and beer garden (frequently in drink) with imperfect sight lines and from cars constantly having to stop to negotiate through access.

Furthermore, the lack of adequate parking pushes parked vehicles to the extremities of the village, causing collateral disruption to residents at those locations. As an example, at 2340hrs on Sunday 28th

May 2017 a bus was parked outside my house with its engine running. It had been parked in this position for over two hours. This was preventing us from sleeping and so we went out to speak to the driver, who apologetically informed us that he was waiting for the wedding party to finish. He was parked there as there is nowhere outside the pub for a bus to park.

Clearly, all of these issues can only be exacerbated by extending the capacity and hours of operation of the pub as proposed in this application. As I have stated, the small hamlet of Thunderbridge is ALREADY saturated with the parked vehicles of pub customers, which spoils the enjoyment of our living space and creates safety and access issues aside from mere irritation.

In conclusion, we feel this application represents nothing less than a clear intention by the Woodman Inn to expand its business operations in the pursuit of profit, to the detriment of residents and with complete disregard for their quality of life. We accept that there is a balance to be struck between the encouragement and facilitation of business enterprise and the wishes and rights of residents. However, we must stress that Thunderbridge is NOT the town centre. It is a rural setting and it is from this idyllic rural setting from which The Woodman Inn derives a large part of its desirability as a venue. It is therefore somewhat hypocritical for the owners of the pub to erode and subvert these characteristics with this application.

I would like to raise my concerns regarding this proposed change around an application. I live in Thunderbridge at Rose Cottage, 8 Thunderbridge Lane.

I have always been supportive of The Woodman Inn and recognise the need for entrepreneurial investment. However there is a point when it is too much to be in keeping with a small hamlet and appropriate with the infrastructure around the area.

We are concerned that the proposal will increase an already struggling car parking situation, travel safety and noise. Their plan is to now include a marquee from the newly built orangery, which will give them a possible 200 guest capability. Unlike a building, a marquee has little sound insulation and the noise potential is going to increase greatly. Alongside this; and their option of live music, guests will be leaving at midnight or later, loud shouting, taxis and disorderly behaviour to name a few problems. We already experience some components of this at a weekend, however the increased numbers will impact now on our well being and life style.

At no point was a marquee music venue & wedding option raised in the planning. Therefore I think it is important that you are made aware that the hamlet of Thunderbridge cannot accommodate the proposed.

I write to express serious concerns with the application of the Woodman Inn to extend its licence to the recently developed orangery and the garden area promoted as 'Thunderbridge Gardens' which if approved will allow the Woodman Inn to intentionally avoid the scrutiny, restrictions and controls of the planning system.

As residents of Thunderbridge we strongly believe that the proposal will –

- Bring traffic chaos and exacerbate what is an existing issue
- Create unacceptable levels of noise and disruption
- Affect the quality of life of the residents

Thunderbridge is a small hamlet with infrastructure commensurate with its size and the very features which The Woodman Inn promotes to sell itself will be destroyed by the licence extension and bring chaos, noise and disruption to this quiet rural location and have a detrimental impact on the quality of life of the residents.

As you are aware, the planning application and subsequent approval was for "a change in use of lower ground floor to commercial catering kitchen, erection of orangery and boiler room and alterations". However, The Woodman are advertising 'Thunderbridge Gardens' as an outdoor wedding venue, catering for weddings with a capacity of up to 150 people. Clearly they cannot cater for weddings of this size within the orangery, which is why they are advertising the use of a wedding marquee.

Of particular concern is the undoubted significant increase in traffic, parking and noise which a venue of this size will create; bearing in mind that this could potentially occur nearly every Friday and Saturday night.

During the initial consultation period before planning permission was granted, Tim Wood from the Highways Development Management Team expressed concerns regarding the highway capacity and safety, and initially said that they **"cannot support this application because of its lack of parking provision"**. Hence, one of the conditions of the subsequent planning approval was that the development must have 20 spaces allocated for use by the development. This must have been based on the fact that the orangery was going to be the new function room, as there was no mention of any other use of the garden area as a function space in the planning application.

Given the fact that the orangery as a function space could probably cater for up to 40 guests at the most, and the Highways team insisted that 20 dedicated spaces should be allocated to it - how many dedicated spaces would have been required for 150 guests?!

Weddings of this size will therefore significantly increase these problems of road safety and capacity for anyone who is trying to travel down Thunder Bridge Lane. The Woodman Inn is already a very popular pub, restaurant and wedding venue which results in congestion along Thunder Bridge Lane virtually every weekend. The car park currently cannot accommodate the volume of guests from the existing business, with cars always being parked right along Thunder Bridge Lane, creating a single lane thoroughfare for several hundred metres. This creates issues, not only for the residents on Thunder Bridge Lane, but also affects the junctions onto Grange Lane and Dam Hill. Further, given that the beer garden is situated across this road from the pub it already poses a safety risk for customers and drivers.

The other main concern, is the impact on noise for local residents which weddings of this size would create. Responding to concerns from the planning application, conditions around noise were attached to the approval however this relates to the orangery and by extending the licence it would allow music (including live bands) to be set up within the garden area. A marquee will not provide the sound insulation qualities to adhere to the planning condition especially as access to the toilets requires a journey to a separate building and therefore the doors will be in effect open all the time so noise will spill out.

In addition having potentially 150 people (plus those who are using the pub / restaurant without being at the wedding) milling around Thunder Bridge Lane will create unacceptable disruption and noise for local residents seriously affecting the quality of life. Current licensing restrictions are being ignored with drinking outside taking place after midnight despite it being limited to 11pm and people still milling around beyond 2pm with shouting and swearing (video evidence is available but too large to attach). This is just a snapshot from this past Friday but unfortunately it is a typical occurrence with many residents of Thunder Bridge Lane dreading the increased activity which this extension will bring.

As Thunderbridge is a small hamlet and 'Thunderbridge Gardens' is within a conservation area, I feel that a wedding venue of this size will destroy the tranquillity and nature of the area, particularly for local residents.

It would be appreciated if you could forward a copy of my email to Tim Wood from the Highways team given his initial concerns

As this is only a small hamlet it can not accommodate the amount of traffic at present but will become significantly worse if they are granted the extension.

We were not aware of the proprietor's intentions for a large marquee and out door music and if this was the case would have appealed to their original planning application. I feel this was their original intention and have misled everyone including the council. I can not understand how the Council have allowed this in the first instance, along with their out door toilets in a conservation area which I think is inappropriate to the hamlet of Thunder Bridge.

If you could also pass this information to Tim Wood from the Highway Development to make him aware of my concerns regarding this issue.

I ask you to take our concerns into consideration as a resident of Thunder Bridge which was once a peaceful village hamlet and has now been taken over by the woodman inn with no consideration for its residents.

My partner and I wish to register our objection to any changes being made to the current licensing arrangements regarding the Woodman public house.

Our property is within 200 yards of the pub and we already suffer a certain amount of late night noise from their customers. We tolerate this on a live and let live basis and on the understanding that things don't get worse. Parking is usually difficult and even though there are sizeable car parks, customers (and some staff!) often seem to prefer to park on the street. At peak times, it almost impossible to drive safely along Thunderbridge Lane.

The proposed changes can only make things considerably worse, particularly in respect of loud music being played until midnight and no doubt beyond as, in my experience, there is rarely any attempt by management to curtail boisterous behaviour.

Thunder Bridge is a small hamlet which is now starting to be dominated by the requirements and preferences of the Woodman business and if we are not careful we may end up becoming a 'wedding theme park' existing for their benefit.

If I recall correctly, at one time expansion of the Woodman was restricted, presumably by the council. In recent times however they have purchased the small cottage attached to the left side of the property and, of course more recently the property across the road. I think their presence in the community now is at levels that can only just be accommodated and that to go beyond those levels will seriously diminish the pleasure of living in what is supposed to be a peaceful little hamlet.

 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
