

### Please give a general description of the premises (please read guidance note 1)

This is a redevelopment site for which no rateable value has been fixed attributable to the proposed development of a Hotel on the site. Building works have commenced and therefore a Band C fee is payable.

It is intended that the premises, when complete, will operate as a bespoke luxury hotel with related accommodation, dining and function facilities.

Both a formal and less formal dining offer will be made available to residents and members of the public. The offers will include a restaurant offering a' la carte fine dining in the evening and a less formal breakfast, brunch, lunch and afternoon tea offer throughout the day in the restaurant, bar and external areas (weather dependant). In room dining will also be available upon request.

The hotel was a former Kirklees Council building formally utilised as a remand home for young persons and was de-commissioned some years ago. It has stood dormant since that time before the sympathetic restoration of the main buildings and redevelopment of the grounds by the Applicant.

The restaurant, bar, multiple function areas, gym and a single luxury bedroom will be located at ground level a further 9 bedrooms and roof terrace area will be located on the first floor. A cellar bar will also be created as described on deposited plans.

The details of the development are shown on the drawings identified below, deposited with this application, in respect of which Planning Permission has been granted.

It is proposed that the permitted hours for licensable activities for these premises should be as follows:

- 1. For non-residents Monday Thursday 07.00 24.00 and Friday Sunday 07.00 02.00.
- 2. The sale of alcohol to residents will be available 24 hours per day, seven days per week.

The earlier commencement hour for the sale of alcohol to non-residents is sought to facilitate a limited service of alcohol with breakfast such as a Champagne celebratory breakfast or Bloody Marys, it is not anticipated that traditional bar services would commence before 10:00hrs daily.

This application seeks to licence the premises specifically to authorise under the Licensing Act 2003 the following activities:

- 1. Exhibition of a film principally non-live television or educational videos.
- 2. The sale of alcohol.
- 3. The provision of late night refreshment after 23.00.
- 4. The provision of regulated entertainment (live and recorded music, performance of dance) as detailed in the appropriate box on the following pages.

It is proposed that the redevelopment of the site in the manner proposed at this location will improve the area by providing jobs for the local community and a new Hotel facility at this location.

### a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 10)

The steps which we have identified in relation to the four licensing objectives are listed below

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below:

- 1. The use of door staff will be risk assessed on an ongoing basis by the licence holder of premises supervisor. Where engaged, door staff shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- 2. Staff will receive training on matters concerning underage sales, drugs policies and operating procedures.
- 3. There shall be a zero tolerance policy in relation to drugs at the premises and there shall be regular checks by management to prevent the use of drugs by patrons. Drugs seized shall be stored securely and handed to the police.
- 4. The premises shall operate a proof of age scheme and will require photographic identification from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years.
- 5. The management of the premises will liaise with police on issues of local concern or disorder.
- 6. CCTV will be installed with recording facilities such recordings shall be retained for a period of 28 days and made available within a reasonable time upon a suitable request by the police which accords with the terms of Data Protection legislation.
- 7. There shall be no drinks promotions at the premises which are inconsistent with the need to promote responsible drinking.

#### c) Public safety

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below:

- To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time.
- 2. The premises will have adequate safety and fire fighting equipment and such equipment will be maintained in good operational order.

- 3. Staff will be trained on matters of safety, evacuation and use of emergency equipment as required.
- 4. Spillages and breakages will be removed as soon as possible to reduce the risk to patrons and staff.
- 5. Toughened glasses will be used in the premises where appropriate.
- Fire Exits and means of escape shall be kept clear and in good operational condition.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below:

- 1. Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- Patrons will be encouraged by staff to leave quietly and respect the interests of the occupiers of any nearby noise sensitive premises, Where appropriate the licensee or a suitable staff member will monitor patrons leaving at the closing time.
- Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 4. Contact numbers for local taxi firm(s) shall be kept at the premises and made available to patrons requiring a taxi.

#### e) The protection of children from harm

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below:

- The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply. No unusual or additional risks of harm to children have been identified.
- 2. No films or videos of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority certification.
- 3. Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter or remain at the premises after 21:00 unless resident, dining with an adult or attending a pre booked function.
- 4. There shall be adequate controls in place including staff training to safeguard against the sale of alcohol to persons under 18 years.
- 5. The premises supervisor or appointed staff member shall ensure that when children are admitted to the premises their presence is not inconsistent with the style of operation of the premises at that time and the licensable activities that are being carried out.
- 6. Policies in relation to children shall be adequately communicated to patrons by staff or through appropriate signage.

We would like to oppose the application of license by The Manor House to sell/provide alcohol and play music until 2am on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. The Manor House is in the heart of Lindley's residential area and is surrounded by homes. It is not appropriate that a venue in a residential area is allowed to be open, sell alcohol and play music until the early hours of the morning. A similar venue in Mirfield, Northorpe Hall, which is also in a residential area has a very limited license and we think that The Manor House should also be subjected to the same rules.

There are now a number of late night venues in the heart of Lindley which are causing problems for the residents in the early hours of the morning, i.e after midnight, including anti social behaviour by intoxicated people; beeping of taxis etc. Lindley is a mixed use locality for living, shopping and socialising however, it seems that some late night businesses forget that people also live here. Due to the location of our home, we are already disturbed most weekends by noise associated with people who have drunk far too much alcohol.

We would like to strongly oppose this license and ask the Council to reject this application.

### Dear Chairperson

Application 143924 Manor House, Lindley.

I live at 2A Lidget Street. Lindley, directly opposite this new venue. I wish to make several objections to the application 143924.

- 1) I object to the supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises until 2.00am for the following reasons:
- a) I live directly opposite this venue, my house is slightly below the level of the road, this means that cars and taxis leaving the venue will shine their headlights directly into the 2 main bedrooms in my house and cause us to wake up.
- b) Allowing the venue to sell alcohol until 2am and allowing for drinking-up time, will mean that taxis will be arriving and leaving, along with some of the guests until 3am in the morning.
- c) Allowing this to happen on a Sunday evening/Monday morning has an impact on those of us trying to sleep ready for work or school on Monday morning. It is unacceptable.
- d) Some people already use the Clock Tower as a convenient place to arrange to be picked up in a taxi after a night out "on Lindley". So, those of us living there are woken by car doors and voices between 11.30 and 12.30 as people are collected.

Others use the Clock Tower as a convenient drop off point after an evening out in Huddersfield, this involves lots of slamming car doors, shouts of goodbye and often loud conversations about other people or the cost of going out etc. These happen between about 12.30 -2.00 am. Allowing Manor House to sell alcohol until 2.00am just extends all of this noise and disruption for another hour.

e) Allowing Manor House to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises just makes it permissible for the local Sainsburys store to ask for an extension to their licensing hours.

Please spare a thought for the ordinary people who have to live here. This is not in a city centre where you might expect hours to be extended if you chose to live there. This is a residential area which is very quickly being turned into a commercial area with all the disadvantages of noise, pollution from busy roads and disruption.
