"According to a new poll by Censuswide on behalf of the National Secular Society:

- 72% of the population think food produced by non-stun slaughter should be clearly labelled (only 4% think it should not)
- 70% think that stunning animals before slaughter is more ethical
- 60% would not want to eat meat that they knew had been produced from non-stun slaughter
- 58% think that the religious exemptions to the requirement for stunning should be removed

Therefore will you ensure that all meat from non-stun slaughter is clearly labelled in Kirklees schools, ensure that all schools offering this meat also offer a separate meat option for children who do not want to eat it, and reconsider whether the council should continue providing this meat to schools at all?"
