NMG – Neighbourhood Management Group – it is important that different agencies dealing with crime and anti-social behaviour are working together to give a coordinated response to issues in our area. This is the role of the NMG. Already we have used these meeting to address a number of problems in the area. By its nature these meetings are held in private to ensure intelligence can be provided and acted upon.

Casework

Much of my time is taken up with helping local people with local and individual issues. This can cover everything from sorting out pot holes to pigeons to complex Council Tax and benefit problems.

Having only been a Councillor for 12 months I consider my greatest achievement to be the good working relationships I have built up not just in the community but with staff in Kirklees Council, this has made it much easier to deal with casework.

An example of some of the casework I have been dealing with is ensuring Newsome Mills is secure. It is constantly been broken into which puts the building and the people accessing it at risk. I have spoken to Kirklees Council, the owners and the Police to get action to replace and repair fencing. It is vital that this building is developed to secure its future.
