Council

Tenants and Residents Association – I work closely with the Edale Ave TRA as well as the newly organised TRA at Holme Park/Bishops Court flats, Berry Brow.

Kirklees Neighbourhood Housing - I feel that I work closely with the staff at KNH and attend Estate Inspections whenever requested, by attending the Estate Inspections you get a better feel for what is happening on what can be challenging areas of our community.

Casework/Community

Much of my time is taken up with helping local people with issues on a personal and individual basis. This can range from problems with benefits to pot holes, pigeons and rats. I have a wonderful gentleman who loves to ring me up to tell me where all the new pot holes are in Newsome and then takes great pleasure in ringing me back to tell me the pot holes have been filled!

Casework highlights have included:

Newsome Mills – constant problems with vandalism and security of fencing that I am reporting and monitoring

Skip Hire – issues are environmental and pollution related. We are working closely with Kirklees Environmental Health and the Environment Agency on this issue.

Local plan – residents of Newsome are under threat from developers wanting to build on areas such as gardens and allotments. We are making strong representation on this issue.

Newsome Bowling Green – We are constantly battling with the developer on this matter and are keeping members of the Bowling Club informed of progress.

And as ever we have our fair share of fly tipping, overgrown vegetation, noise nuisance, street lighting, parking issues to deal with – the list is endless!

Other Voluntary activity

During the school holidays I enjoy helping out at the KFTRA breakfast club and the Lowerhouses Lunch Club. It isn't about going in with your 'Councillor hat' on, it's about mucking in and doing what is needed from serving food to washing up.

In Newsome we have a wealth of talented people especially the younger people.
