Ward Work

I started to become involved in some casework whilst campaigning to be elected and during the year have dealt with 231 cases. These cases covered a wide range of issues such as income and benefit problems, refuse collection, crime & fear of crime, council house repairs, obtaining a council property, fly tipping, neighbour disputes, road safety issues and infestations. I have also worked with and represented groups of residents with particular local issues such as problems with footpaths, residential care, fly tipping, noise nuisance, anti-social behaviour and planning issues.

For most of the year I and my ward colleagues, ClIrs Hall and Sheard, have stood at a market stall once a month but most of the issues and cases that I have dealt with have arisen through telephone contact or email followed up by home visits.

It has been a problem to find a suitable building in which to hold regular surgeries but I may be able to resolve this in the near future.

Achievements During the Year

- Provision of traffic calming measures to discourage speeding cars & lorries cutting through a residential area.
- Representing local residents to have an unusable footpath closed which was a site attracting anti-social behaviour.
- Getting gates put on the bottom entrance to the cemetery to prevent 'joy-riding' around the cemetery grounds.
- Organising public meetings and supporting a group of Council tenants to form a tenants & residents association to address problems with their properties and surrounding area.
- Resurfacing of 3 unadopted streets that were in a serious state of disrepair and providing additional street lighting in one of them.
- Getting an issue about residential care for adults with learning disabilities looked at by a Scrutiny Panel and addressing the issue directly with the Primary Care Trust.
- Improvements to Firth park.

Many of the achievements in Heckmondwike have been accomplished by co-working with my fellow ward Councillors and also some have been achieved through joint working with our local MP Mike Woods and his team. My thanks to them.
