National Parks & Access To The Countryside Act, 1949
Part IV. Survey of Public Rights of Way.
Paths Nos 3 and 4 (Holmfirth) and 14, 15, 16, 18 & 19 Meltham.

Thank you for your letter of the 24th instant, the contents of which are noted.

As you may be aware, Meltham Parish Council have recently been invited to consider the Definitive Map and to advise this office of any anomalies; any paths they feel should be added to the map, or increased in status.

In their eventual reply they may well refer to the paths in which you are interested. However, notwithstanding the possibility of duplication, it will help if you will again name the precise parts of the paths you feel should be Bridleways and support such claims by having as many of the enclosed Information Sheets completed as possible.

In your letter of the 5th March, 1973, you say you have "obtained ample evidence of over 20 years of use". However, the possibility of objections to such claims will not have escaped you and it has to be pointed out that a substantial amount of evidence of Bridleway user may be required.

Please return the completed sheets to this office at your convenience and if any additional sheets should be required, these could be provided on request.
