19/06/2017	ERG459106	<p>Report from a member of the public:</p> <p>"I wish to report an ongoing issue regarding a locked gate at the junction of Old Paul's Lane and Wilshaw Road. I have been riding my horse on this track for many decades without any problem but gates have been closed at each end for some time now. The gate at the junction with Woodnook Lane is not locked but the one at the other end where the track meets Wilshaw Road is. There is no reason for this gate to be locked as all gates to fields adjoining the length of the track are secure and there have been no reports of loose livestock via the track on to the road. I am aware that the highland cattle which are kept in fields further along Wilshaw Road do escape from time to time but this not an issue to do with Old Paul's Lane..."</p> <p>"One of the reasons this track is (was) used regularly is because it enables horseriders to avoid very busy and dangerous roads around Meltham Mills and Honley. Bridleways and tracks are in short supply in Kirklees and there are very few places where horse riders can ride safely in the area."</p>
