Dear Sir/ Madam

Re proposed traffic calming measures Bradshaw Road Honley.

I wish to raise concerns and object to the proposed traffic calming measures.

I live at no [REDACTED] and am actually more concerned about parking and the impact that this has on safety.

I park my car to the rear of my property which is accessed via Sycamore Terrace. Sycamore terrace residents park there too.

I realise street parking is not an offence, but I frequently struggle to see as I leave the terrace to enter Bradshaw Road due to the number of cars parked close to junction, in fact right up against it. (On a number of occasions the vehicle concerned has been the road safety partnership speed camera van).

The proposed position of humps and cushions will, I believe add to the parking issues and I am also concerned about increased noise particularly at night.

I also note, that when comparing the drawings dated December 2024 to those I received dated June 2023, that the position of the humps and cushions has changed. I would be grateful if you could comment on this and explain the change.

I appreciate and share concerns re speed and road safety however I am not convinced that humps and cushions are the answer, perhaps an adjustment in speed or movement of the national speed limit sign higher up Bradshaw Road might avoid the often seen 'race to hit 60' near the houses.

Please note, I would welcome a permanent camera.

In addition I frequently walk on Meltham Road where these were installed and continue to see vehicles driving above the speed limit.

Can I also add that the position of the on street notices, which I have been looking for following a letter I received in December last year. It was made very difficult to see them and read them as they were wrapped around small diameter poles and attached with cable ties obscuring some of the text; they were also placed after the dated 14 March.
