Post close, The Cow Pasture the Low Honey Hill, The round stony Hells a certain Throgs called the Millers Throgs and across a certain Close of Land called Millers Hill all in the Township of Farnley Tyas aforesaid in the Riding aforesaid in the several Occupiers of the said William Earl of Dartmouth Joseph Fisher Stephen Howell Cockell and Bennett, Jonathan Senior the Spenger and one Sarah Kidgarn and terminates forty yards from the North West Corner of a certain Building called Woodsome Mill in the Township of Farnley Tyas aforesaid, in the occupation of the said Sarah Kidgarn and having received evidence of the consent of the said William Earl of Dartmouth to the said new footway being made through his lands lastly heretofore described by writing under his Hand and Seal we do hereby order that the said Footway be diverted and turned through the Lands lastly aforesaid And we do order an equal apportionment not exceeding the rate of six pence in the pound to be made levied and collected upon all and every the Occupiers of Lands tenements Woods tithes and hereditaments in the said several Townships of Almondbury, Farnley Tyas, Thurstonsland and Kirk Burton respectively in the Riding aforesaid, in the proportions between the said several Townships according to the respective lengths of the said Old and New or substituted footways respectively and that the money arising thereupon be paid and applied according to the directions of the statute made in the thirteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, for the amendment and preservation of the Highways
