- 1.1 The national maternity review Better Births¹ made recommendations for the planning, design and safe delivery of maternity services; how women, babies and families will be able to get the type of care they want, and how staff will be supported to deliver such care.
- 1.2 The West Yorkshire and Harrogate Health and Care Partnership have developed a vision for a West Yorkshire and Harrogate (WY&H) Local Maternity System (LMS) which is based on the needs and collaboration of women, their partners and their families.
- 1.3 The vision of the WY&H LMS is to ensure women, their babies and their families can access the services they choose and need, as close to home as possible. The WY&H LMS Plan states a commitment to develop and nurture a culture which puts women and babies at the centre of care, supports multi-professionalism, values learning and has the safety of women and their babies as a golden thread throughout.
- 1.4 Maternity is now a programme that is embedded within the WY&H Health and Care Partnership and the implementation stage of the programme includes the development of community hubs
- 1.5 Representatives from local CCGs and the WY&H Health and Care Partnership will be in attendance to provide the Panel with: the background and context to the work that is taking place; an overview how the local plan will be actioned and implemented in Kirklees by the two acute trust; the impact and implications of the changes to local services; and details of the development of the Community hubs.
